# **Oxfordshire Mind Housing**

Oxfordshire Mind's supported housing service offers accommodation with support in Oxford City and in West and South Oxfordshire. Staff are available Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm, and we have an on-call service out of hours for emergencies.

Accommodation is provided in various settings, including large and small shared houses and self-contained flats.

The service is aimed at Oxfordshire residents with mental health problems aged 18-65, who would struggle to live independently. Residents are supported to move out to independent housing within 2 years.

#### Emmaus Oxford (https://emmaus.org.uk/oxford/)

Emmaus communities provide a home and meaningful work for people who have experienced homelessness, helping them to find a way to move on with their lives.

The charity provides accommodation and work in Oxford for 28 people, otherwise at risk of homelessness, whom they call Companions. Emmaus is a two-way agreement, and they will not be giving you charity. They are asking for you to come and be part of the community until you feel you're ready to move on. If you feel you might be suitable for Emmaus, but would like to know more, then give them a call on the number below. You can also ask someone else to do this with you. It is also fine to arrange to go and have a look round.
