I haven't had my vaccination yet and now it's too late to get one

It's not too late! If you've not booked your appointment yet, you're still eligible and can book anytime. Just visit the [National Booking Service](#) or call 119.

The Covid-19 vaccines aren't safe and haven't been checked properly

The Covid-19 vaccines are safe. They have gone through the same strict safety and quality checks as other vaccines have.

Vaccinated people can transmit the vaccination to unvaccinated people

Covid-19 vaccines can't be transmitted. None of the Covid-19 vaccines are capable of replicating and infecting their host because they do not use live viruses and because researchers have not developed self-spreading vaccines for humans yet.

Having the Covid-19 vaccine can change my DNA

The Covid-19 vaccines do not change DNA. They enable your immune system to recognize and produce antibodies to fight the virus.
